

**MAYOR & COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
JULY 12, 2012  
7:30 p.m.**

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Rockaway, in the County of Morris, New Jersey, was held in the Community Center, 21-25 Union Street, Rockaway, N.J. with Mayor Russell Greuter presiding. Mayor Greuter called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Mayor Greuter read the following statement: In accordance with Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, Public Laws, 1975, be advised that notice of this meeting was made by posting on the Bulletin Board, Town Hall, and sending to the officially designated newspapers, a list of meeting dates annually, indicating that the meeting would take place at the Community Center at 7:30 p.m. on July 12, 2012. Mayor Greuter announced the location of the fire exits.

Borough Attorney Ed Wacks was also present.

Everyone present participated in the salute to the flag.

PRESENTATIONS

Councilwoman Kanigel introduced Tom Barbato, President, and other officers of the Rockaway Borough Historical Committee. Mr. Barbato explained that the Committee's first grant from Morris County was used to acquire a historical plaque for the Firehouse, a building which has served public safety for 100 years.

Mr. Thomas Trapasso explained the role of the Picatinny Arsenal Environmental Restoration Advisory Board to clean up the contamination in the arsenal from exploded ordnances. Each municipality surrounding Picatinny may appoint a member as a civilian representative.

Mayor Greuter announced his intention to appoint Mr. Trapasso as a civilian representative from the Borough of Rockaway to the Picatinny Arsenal Environmental Restoration Advisory Board.

Upon motion by Councilman Willer, seconded by Councilman Donofrio and carried unanimously upon voice vote, to concur with Mayor Greuter's appointment of Thomas Trapasso to the Picatinny Arsenal Environmental Restoration Advisory Board.

Mr. John Anderson, Area Manager from Jersey Central Power and Light Company and company liaison to the Borough, explained the steps that the company has taken to improve its communications since last fall. For example, the public can access outage information real time on its improved website and the company can send out updates via e-mail and Twitter.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Upon motion by Councilman Willer, seconded by Councilman Donofrio, and carried unanimously upon voice vote, the minutes of the June 28, 2012 Regular Meeting were accepted as submitted.

CORRESPONDENCE

Mayor Greuter read the July 10, 2012 letter from Dr. John J. Borris, 54 Andrea Dr., Rockaway, NJ, requesting approval for Fire Marshal Tom Trapasso to attend a federally mandated Occupational Safety and Health course for Superfund sites given by him at Picatinny Arsenal July 16-20. Mr. Trapasso has indicated that he has funding in his budget to cover the course's cost of \$200.

On motion by Councilman Mulligan, seconded by Councilman Donofrio, and unanimously carried by voice vote to accept the correspondence and to approve Mr. Tom Trapasso's attendance at a course for Superfund sites to be held at Picatinny Arsenal from July 16-20.

*Police Station Bridge Awning*

Two quotations were received for the Police Station bridge awning. A resolution will be added tonight to award the contract to the company that submitted the lower price.

ORDINANCE NO. 12-12, Public Hearing & Adoption

**ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROCKAWAY  
MAYOR AND COUNCIL  
AMENDING CHAPTER 179, PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS,  
OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROCKAWAY**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Rockaway acquired Block 21, Lots 6 and 25, through an Open Space Trust Fund grant; and

**WHEREAS**, to preserve and uphold the public health, safety and welfare, it is in the best interest of Borough of Rockaway and its residents to promulgate appropriate rules and regulations for the use of this property known as Beach Street River Park.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Rockaway, County of Morris and State of New Jersey, that the following amendments be made to Chapter 179, Parks and Recreation Areas, of the Code of the Borough of Rockaway:

Section I

1. Chapter 179, Parks and Recreation Areas, is hereby amended to add the following Article II, Beach Street River Park:

"Article II, Beach Street River Park

§ 179-6. Property description.

- A. For the purposes of this article, the term "Beach Street River Park" refers to Borough-owned property known as Block 21, Lots 6 and 25, comprising approximately six acres.
- B. The Beach Street River Park is situated along the Rockaway River on Beach Street, east towards Denville, contiguous to the end of East Flagge Street and Broad Street.

§ 179-7. Park hours.

The Beach Street River Park shall be open from dawn to dusk daily.

§ 179-8. Prohibited activities.

A. The following activities are prohibited at all time:

- (1) Operation of motor vehicles of all types, including but not limited to dirt bikes, motorcycles, ATV vehicles and snowmobiles; except Police, emergency and Borough-owned vehicles.
- (2) Hunting.
- (3) Loitering.
- (4) Fires of all types, including charcoal burners.
- (5) Use of glass or any product made of glass.
- (6) Littering or dumping, pursuant to the requirements of § 149-18.
- (7) Digging and/or removal of natural fauna or floral.
- (8) Open or unguarded swimming along the river.
- (9) Dogs running at large and failure to clean up after dogs, pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 121, Dogs, Cats and Other Animals.
- (10) Feeding water fowl or other animals, pursuant to the requirements of § 121-13.
- (11) Possession or consumption of any alcoholic beverage, pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 91, Article III, Drinking in Public Places.
- (12) Smoking.
- (13) Overnight camping.

§ 179-9. Parental responsibility for juveniles.

The regulations set forth in Chapter 183, Article II, Curfew and Parental Responsibility for Juveniles, notwithstanding, a parent or guardian of a child under 18 years of age and who fails or neglects to exercise reasonable supervision and control of the conduct of said child shall be held liable in a civil action for any willful, malicious or unlawful injury or destruction by such a child of the real or personal property on this site or adjacent properties.

§ 179-10. Violations and penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this article shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by one or more of the following: by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$2,000; by imprisonment not exceeding 90 days; or by a period of community service not exceeding 90 days, all in the discretion of the Court.

§ 179-11. Enforcement.

The provisions of this article shall be enforced by the Superintendent of Public Works or a member of the Police Department or the Rockaway Borough Health Department.

§ 179-12. Interference with authorities unlawful.

No person shall hinder, molest or interfere with anyone authorized or empowered to perform any duty under this chapter."

Section II

1. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.
2. All Ordinances of the Borough of Rockaway which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
4. This Ordinance shall take effect as provided by law.
